

Yasuko Hassall Kobayashi is assistant professor in the Global Japanese Studies Program, Graduate School of Letters at Osaka University. She specialises in inter-Asian and Pacific migration/mobilities, and her research covers both historical migration and contemporary migration issues.

Her current historical migration project is Japanese POWs in Papua New Guinea during and after WWII. She was recently awarded a research grant by the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science for a project entitled “Soldiers as mobile subjects: Japanese POWs Experiences in PNG during and after WWII”.

Her contemporary migration project is disaster prevention and immigrants, and she has recently been awarded a research grant by the Murata Science Foundation for her collaborative project with A/Professor Hitomi Nakanishi (University of Canberra, Australia).

She is also a co-investigator of the National Research Foundation of Korea funded project, “*Mobility Humanities based on the Co-Evolution of Human Being and Technologies: Worlding the Human-Mobility Societies in the Future*” hosted in Konkuk University, Korea.
